The Management Board of Fondation Mines-Telecom appoints Dominique Poiroux as its new president

The Management Board of Fondation Mines-Telecom unanimously elected Dominique Poiroux as president of the Foundation on October 4, 2023. He succeeds Claude Imauven, president of Fondation Mines-Telecom since 2020. Dominique Poiroux will work in close collaboration with the Foundation's Management Board and Executive Committee, which was re-elected on this occasion.*



Dominique Poiroux is a graduate of Ecole Polytechnique and an engineer of the Corps des Mines. He spent the first part of his career in public administration, first in the regions, then at the Ministry of the Budget. Dominique Poiroux was previously a technical advisor in Alain Madelin's office and then in Jean Arthuis' office at the Ministry of Economics and Finance. He also headed François d'Aubert's office (Secretary of State for Research) and was deputy director of François Bayrou's office at the Ministry of Education.

In 1997, he moved to the private sector, joining the Danone group, where he held a number of positions in France and abroad. He first headed up global R&D (1999-2002) and then the cookies business unit in China (2002-2006). From 2007 to 2019, he devoted himself to Danone's Medical Nutrition Division, first as President of Emerging Countries,

then of Europe, and finally, President of the Global Division. He then led the merger of this business with Danone Baby Nutrition as Senior Vice President of Medical, Research and Innovation at Danone Specialized Nutrition until June 2021.

In July 2021, Dominique Poiroux founded Healthynvest, which he also chairs, to advise investment funds on their acquisition strategies. He is Venture Partner at Eurazeo Kurma AgriFoodTech, and Strategic Partner at ArchiMed. He is an IFA-Sciences Po-certified company director (2022).

Dominique Poiroux is currently Chairman of the School Board of Mines Saint-Etienne. He was also Chairman of the School Board of IMT Mines Albi from 2012 to 2021.

His dual culture inherited from his career as a senior civil servant and businessman as well as his considerable expertise in healthcare will be put to good use in his new role at the head of Fondation Mines-Telecom:

"I have been contributing to Institut Mine-Telecom's mission for over 10 years, and I am proud to be able to serve it in this role as Chairman of the Foundation. It is also an honor for me to succeed Claude Imauven. My aim is to support the growth and excellence of each Institut Mines-Telecom school, mobilizing alumni and corporate sponsors to generate additional financial resources, and I will ensure that they are invested in the diversity and excellence of the engineers and managers we train as well as in the impact of our research and innovations on local communities, in particular for the benefit of France's reindustrialization. I'm also committed to our role as a driving force in major transitions - digital, industrial, climatic, demographic - and to our international influence. I want to work with all Institut Mine-Telecom stakeholders in the most collaborative way possible to maximize our impact, with ambition."

Thanks to its Foundation, Institut Mines-Telecom, France's leading group of public engineering and management schools, has seen its funding from patronage increase significantly, with more than €65 million raised since 2015.

Institut Mine-Telecom's current mission statement expresses its collective commitment to serving society: "All together to imagine and build a sustainable future and to train its key players". To achieve these shared goals, alumni involvement and cooperation with partner companies are fundamental.
