

2025 CALL FOR APPLICATIONS on Staffs' Mobility

1. About EULiST

European Universities Linking Society and Technology (EULiST) is a European university created in 2023 as part of a European Commission initiative to modernize higher education in Europe in a comprehensive and sustainable way.

EULiST brings together 10 partners, among which IMT, with complementary strengths in the engineering, humanities and social sciences: Leibniz University Hannover (Germany), National Technical University of Athens (Greece), Brno University of Technology (Czech Republic), Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava (Slovakia), Lappeenranta University of Technology (Finland), Jönköping University (Sweden), Rey Juan Carlos University (Spain), Vienna University of Technology (Austria), University of L'Aquila (Italy) and Institut Mines-Télécom (France).

EULiST aims at developing new solutions adapted to the ecological transition and climate change, in response to the main socio-economic challenges. It intends to build a sustainable future, with a strong emphasis on technology at the service of society.

The EULiST Alliance comprises over 200,000 students and 20,000 academic and administrative staff.

2. Objectives of the Call for Proposals

The aim of this call is to facilitate the mobility of IMT's administrative and technical staff to EULiST partner universities, fostering knowledge exchange and skills development in an international context.

IMT provides mobility grants to enable such staff from any department (finances, legal, IT, research & education support, innovation...) to share common knowledge, acquire new skills and strengthen the backbone of EULiST as a European University. Expected outcomes of the exchange can be, among others:

- Establish long-term relationships between EULiST partners either by creating new relationships of enhance existing ones,
- improvement of university management and administrative services.
- Development of shared tools for administration and project management within EULiST.
- Skills enhancement in areas such as international mobility, student services, digital transformation, accreditation processes, etc.
- Creation of professional transnational networks among IMT and partner university staff.

A final report in English detailing the outcomes of the exchange shall be submitted to EULiST within three months following the completion of the mobility period.

3. Details of the Mobility Grants

This call for mobilities is aimed primarily at creating new collaborations / enhancing existing collaborations with EULiST partners and develop this Alliance of European Universities:

- The mobility grant will reimburse:
 - Travel to and from the exchange university, with the agreement of the EULiST team,
 - o Local public transports in the exchange location area,



- Daily allowances (100% on the first day and 37% on the other days, based on the amount set by the French Ministry of the Economy, Finance and Industrial and Digital Sovereignty).
- Applications can be submitted by any staff member (non-researcher) **employed by IMT**, from all schools of IMT for a mobility within at least one EULiST university.
- Each party must have a business interest in the exchange.
- The exchange can take place **as soon as possible**. The funding is allocated for a period of **up to 6 months and 1 month minimum.**
- The exchange must fit within the EULiST strategy and needs.
- A final report presenting the results of the exchange in English must be provided to EULiST.

EULiST team at IMT is available to help identifying the best suitable partners within EULiST partners. This team is composed of, among others, Olivier Epinette (olivier.epinette@imt.fr) from International Affairs Directorate as well as Marc Delage (marc.delage@imt.fr) from Scientific Directorate of IMT.

4. Evaluation and Funding

The evaluation will be conducted by the EULiST Board at IMT (Scientific Directorate and International Affairs Directorate).

The financial terms of the exchange are explained in the previous point.

5. Time Frame

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.
